California Citrus State Historic Park was originally created to preserve the rapidly vanishing citrus groves and to tell the farreaching story of the citrus industry and its role in the history of California in the proper setting. 30 years ago, it was envisioned that the park would represent a living history containing acres of groves to show what Arlington Heights would have looked like in the 1920s.


